# Rabbi Daniel Sherman



## Purim Prep & More

Every year I look forward to Purim. After all, what's not to love? Purim, at least at first glance, is all about FUN! We dress up, hear a great story, make lots of noise, sing silly songs, play games, and eat funny-looking cookies – what could be better?

But there is also a serious side of Purim – one that is even more relevant and important as we celebrate this year. Purim reminds us of the presence and effect of anti-Semitism in our world. Whether the story of Mordecai and Esther really happened doesn't really matter. Regardless of whether Haman of the Bible really existed, we Jews have known too many Hamans in real life. Too many individuals and too many peoples who have held something against us Jews and who have plotted our destruction. On Purim we celebrate our survival as a people: despite the Hamans who have risen up against us, we are still here today, shaking our *graggers*, retelling the story, and celebrating our survival. The message of the Scroll of Esther is one of survival and courage and the human capacity to change history. As we read the actions of Mordecai and Esther we are reminded of and inspired by the knowledge that we – you and I – truly can change the world. It is up to each of us; we, too, can be heroes who fight for what is right.

And as we recall the tragedy in Pittsburgh this year, and as we read stories of the spread of anti-Semitism, hate, and prejudice here and around the world, we especially need the light, the message, the courage, and the fun that Purim provides.

So let's truly celebrate Purim this year. We have a lot planned. We will begin on **Sunday, March 17 with our Religious School Megillah Reading followed by our annual Purim Carnival**. It will be lots of fun for our kids of all ages – please plan on dressing in costume and joining us at Temple. Our Purim celebration will continue on **Wednesday evening, March 20 with our 6 pm Purim Service**. We will pray, laugh, listen, and make lots of noise as we hear the Purim story retold this year and celebrate our survival. And stay for a special **Purim dinner afterwards**. Everyone is invited and encouraged to attend.

Some other highlights for this month:

- Please join us for a wonderful **Israel Solidarity** Program on **Sunday, March 3**. We have once again had an amazing year of Israel programs. I want to thank our chair people, Lorelei and Bob Ennis, for their leadership and for all that they do. They will be leading the TDD Team at the Annual AIPAC Policy Conference in Washington, DC also this month, and we look forward to hearing their reports.
- I am looking forward to our annual **BART Shabbat on Friday, March 8**. BART is the Broward Association of Reform Temples. Every year the BART synagogues: Congregation Kol Tikvah in Parkland, Temple Bat Yam in Ft. Lauderdale, Temple Beth El and Temple Solel in Hollywood, Temple Beth Orr in Coral Springs, Temple Kol Ami Emanu-El in Plantation, and Temple Dor Dorim join together as one large Reform community for a Friday night service. I hope you will plan on joining us at 7:30 pm at Congregation Kol Tikvah in Parkland. The clergy of all seven congregation will together lead the service.
- I am also looking forward to attending the annual CCAR (Central Conference of American Rabbis) Convention on March 31 – April 3. This year it is in Cincinnati, OH – meaning I will be returning to the city and place where both Rabbi Lipson and I were ordained. And this year I will be celebrating with my classmates the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our ordination.
- And don't forget to mark your calendars for Passover 5779. Passover begins on Friday evening, April 19. There will be no service at Temple that night. We will have a special Shabbat **and Festival Morning Service on Saturday, April 20**, and we will join together to celebrate as a community at our **2<sup>nd</sup> Night Congregational Pesach Seder that evening**. Stay tuned next month for more Passover details, and good luck with all of the Passover prep!

# Adam Silverman, President



Dear Fellow Congregants:

While Rabbi Sherman has served us with distinction for almost four years, he expressed a desire to explore opportunities outside of Florida. After thoughtful consideration by Rabbi Sherman and our Executive Leadership team, and with mutual respect for the needs and goals of both our congregation and Rabbi Sherman, we have agreed that his tenure with Temple Dor Dorim will conclude on June 30, 2019. The decision was finalized earlier this week; Rabbi Sherman will become the Senior Rabbi at Temple Sinai in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Rest assured, we will not be without a rabbi. Rabbi Sherman will continue to lead our congregation through the end of June. Further, our Board of Trustees is well-prepared and has been in contact with both the Union for Reform Judaism and the Central Conference of American Rabbis. The search process for a new rabbi is underway. In accordance with our By-Laws, we are forming a search committee co-led by Neal Topf, our Executive Vice President, and Peter Shapiro, our Vice President. Finding our next rabbi will take some time and we are resolved not to rush the process. Fortunately, Rabbi Norman Lipson, our Founding Rabbi and Rabbi Emeritus, has graciously offered to assist us while we undertake this important initiative, including leading us in worship during the High Holy Days this fall if needed.

As if this wasn't enough news to digest, and by mere coincidence, Cantor Barry has been presented with an extraordinary opportunity and has decided not to extend her contract, which also expires this summer. Despite our efforts to convince her to stay, Cantor Barry has determined that it is in the best interest of her family to accept this new position. While we have all thoroughly enjoyed Cantor Barry's presence, and quickly become accustomed to having an ordained cantor at TDD, our first priority will be to find our next rabbi.

I recognize that these developments may be disconcerting and disappointing to many. Unquestionably they present Temple Dor Dorim with a unique set of challenges, but none that we cannot overcome. Temple Dor Dorim is stronger now than we were four years ago, our finances are in better shape, and we have much to offer. TDD may be heading into a period of transition, but we are confident that we will emerge with the right person to lead us into our next chapter.

It is paramount that each of you understand that there are no rumors, drama or stories. What I have conveyed to you above is the absolute truth, and you have my word that we will keep everyone informed on our progress. If anything changes, we will let you know that as well. We value each and every member of our TDD family, and now more than ever, seek your support.

I imagine that many of you will have questions, concerns or comments. Please do not hesitate to contact me or any other Board member (all of whom are listed on page 5 with contact information). We also intend to host two town hall meetings on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and April 3<sup>rd</sup> (information forthcoming) so that each and every congregant who wants to discuss these issues with the Temple's lay leadership will have an opportunity to do so. Any members with a planned life cycle event (e.g., Bar/Bat Mitzvah, wedding, etc.) between July 1 and December 31, 2019 can expect to receive a phone call from either me or Neal Topf to personally discuss and address any questions or concerns that you may have.

In the meantime and over the next several months, please join me, your Board of Trustees and fellow congregants in thanking Rabbi Sherman and Cantor Barry for their service to TDD, and wishing them well in their future endeavors.

Of all our sacred texts, one passage that I have always found especially profound comes from the prophet Isaiah. On Yom Kippur, our most sacred of days, we read God’s message from Chapter 58: “Is this the fast I desire? A day to afflict body and soul?...Is not this the fast I desire...to share your bread with the hungry and to take the homeless poor into your home?...If you offer your *nefesh* (soul) to the hungry and satisfy the suffering—then shall your light shine through the darkness and your night become bright as noon.”

In our High Holy Day *machzor*, we are taught that the use of *nefesh* “suggests a profound giving of the self - not only the act of sharing food with those in need but also sharing one’s attention, offering empathy, understanding, the warmth of human connection.”

I am blessed in my life to have had the opportunity to work in a soup kitchen in an urban institution...and in a climate much colder than that of South Florida. People came in from the cold for a hot meal and were treated as guests. They sat at tables decorated with linens and flowers, were served with kind words, warm smiles and well-wishes. It was a life-changing experience.

Here at Temple Dor Dorim, we do wonderful work collecting food for the hungry and organizing projects for Mitzvah Day and other times throughout the year. I would like to offer my wish that, as a community, we find opportunities to offer of ourselves in a more personal way and that we work to discover how our souls may touch the souls of others. As humans, we crave deeper, stronger connections. By giving through active compassion, we have the power to fill the world with light. May we continue to build on our sacred work and move toward a brighter future together.



# Sheila Woldenberg, Early Childhood Director



“KidSafe for Kids” is one of the special programs that make our Pre-K VPK classes top notch! The KidSafe program is an 8 week program paid for by CHAI, our PTO, designed for children 4 years of age through 5th grade. Children learn safety skills through fun, developmentally appropriate techniques such as role play, songs, art, discussion and the foundation’s two award winning children’s books: *My Body is Special and Belongs to Me!* and *Jack Teaches his Friends to be KidSafe*. Our Pre-K classes learn how to stay safe through the KidSafe program curriculum. This program empowers children by giving them a strong voice with which to defend themselves, and teaches the parents, teachers, and the professionals in their lives how to keep them safe. KidSafe’s educational program creates a first line of defense to prevent child sexual abuse and exploitation. Co-founders, Sally Berenzweig, MEd, MA and Cherie Benjoseph, LCSW, developed the KidSafe curriculum. Both are recognized child safety experts, mental health professionals, educators, authors, public speakers, and moms with over 50 years of combined experience. Kid Safe’s educational philosophy is backed by years of safety instruction, best practices and up-to-date research.

The first lesson covered is personal safety. The children brainstormed the many safety rules they already follow and were introduced to the concept of “Me” safety. The second week the children learned to use their safety voice to keep their friends and themselves safe. They even learned the difference between tattling and reporting. The third week they were taught the buddy system. Children learned the importance of staying close to trusted adults to stay safe. The fourth week the children learned about “Check First.” They were taught the concept of checking first with a grown-up before doing most things. The last four weeks the classes covered having a support group of adults to go to whenever they may need to talk and when to use their assertive voice in certain situations. The classes ended with a KidSafe graduation where parents were invited to attend. The children reviewed the whole eight weeks of lessons with their parents. Parents were presented the curriculum and the safety rules their children have been taught.

Our teachers recently spent a day at David Posnack JCC for the annual JECF (Jewish Early Childhood Professionals Conference). It’s always great learning about the latest trends in Jewish education.

Spring break is March 25 through March 29. We offer a mini camp for children 3 months through third grade. Children do not have to be enrolled in the preschool to attend spring mini camp. Call the office for more details.

Early bird registration has ended for camp and the upcoming school year, but it’s not too late to register for both. # Jamie Mafdali, RJE, Director of Youth Engagement: Learning & Programs



When thinking of Purim, we often think of carnivals, *hamantaschen*, the (whole) *megillah*, and masks. Let's break it down a bit. Why do we have a carnival on or around Purim? I'm glad you asked. Towards the end of the Book/Scroll of Esther, we read that Purim should be a day of "festive joy" and to make it a day of "feasting and merrymaking, and an occasion for sending gifts to one another and presents to the poor." So, having a carnival is one way to ensure festive joy and merrymaking!

How about the hamantaschen? Well, I'm a traditionalist on this one...I like poppy filled hamantaschen. The term comes from the German words *mohn* (poppy) and *taschen* (pockets).

The megillah or *Megillat Esther* is the scroll of Esther which contains the story of Purim. It is a *mitzvah* to hear the *megillah* on Purim.

Lastly, I mentioned masks. While I am not sure exactly why masks initially became associated with Purim, I can tell you why I think they are a perfect fit. Esther, who we know was chosen by King Ahashverosh, hid her true identity. We all have certain masks we wear. Purim is a time to recognize the masks we wear and then find our true selves and share it with the world. We can only experience true festive joy when we are comfortable with who we are.

- 2) Send **Mishloach Manot** (gifts of food) to friends and family. Be sure to include at least 2 ready to eat foods, preferably some *hamentashen*! Bake your own and use your imagination to create all kinds of fun fillings!
- 3) Give **Manot L'Evyonim** (gifts, specifically money, to the poor).
- 4) Enjoy a **Seudat Purim** (festive Purim meal) as extravagant as you are able to make it (or join us after the [Purim Service](#) on Wednesday, March 20 at 7:00 pm ~ See page 17 for more information).

Do you know that there are many creative ways to interpret the commandment to hear the reading of the Scroll of Esther? Yes, the "whole *megillah*." Humorous plays that retell the story of Purim are referred to as Purim *spiels*, and are limited only by the writer's imagination! 



## MARCH EMPTY NESTERS "SENIOR SPOTLIGHT"

This month our Spotlight features **Carol Kaufman Rosenbloom** and, by her own admission, she has an "atypical" story. Born in the Flatbush section of Brooklyn, as the oldest of 4 siblings and, before moving to Montreal Canada at age 13, adventurous Carol relished the famous Cyclone and Parachute rides at Coney Island. Moving to Montreal, as you might expect, was a culture shock to Carol, however, she quickly acclimated by attending school, learning French and making many friends along the way. At age 18, Carol was introduced to skiing and, as the story goes, inadvertently, got trapped on the expert hill and zoomed to the bottom into a heap of snow. There she was rescued by Harvey Rosenbloom, her love at first sight, and after a hot chocolate and 18 months touring on his new motor scooter, he became her husband. While in Montreal, they parented son Bruce followed by daughter Laurie (and currently 3 grandchildren). They were forced to move to Toronto in 1967 when the separatist, terrorist and paramilitary group, FLQ (Quebec Liberation Front), became violent. They loved Toronto. Carol settled in to her career teaching Arts and Crafts while working with learning disabled students in the public school system. The family moved to Miami in 1976 and Carol became the Art Director and pre-school teacher at Temple Kol Ami. Several years later, she accepted an offer by the David Posnack Hebrew Day School to develop and teach a curriculum for 4 year olds. Then, in 2005, she was promoted to Director of Publicity and Public relations, which led her to writing an advice column in the Sun Sentinel, Shalom section. Carol and Harvey joined our Temple and Empty Nesters and, after 59 years of marriage, Harvey passed. We are thankful that Carol remains an active Temple and Nesters' member, as she reads to the ECC classes on Mondays, attends Rabbi Lipson's Torah class and can often be found at Shabbat dinners and services as well as at many of our Empty Nesters functions.






