A MONTH OF SPECIAL DAYS

The Fall High Holy Days go by many names. We call the 10 days at the beginning of the Jewish Year, from Rosh HaShanah through Yom Kippur, the “*YAMIM NORAIM* – the Days of Awe.” This name reminds us of the awe and holiness with which we mark the Holy Day season.

As I look at the calendar for May this year, it seems to me that we could call this season our “*YAMIM MEYUCHADIM* – the Special Days,” because the month is filled with special and important days that stand out on our calendar. Here’s what I mean:

YOM HASHOAH: We begin with our annual Holocaust Memorial Day, as we remember the 6 Million Jews who were killed in the *Shoah* and honor the survivors and their families. I hope you will plan on joining us for a very special community Yom HaShoah Memorial Service on Wednesday, May 1 at 7:00 pm here at Temple. I am so pleased that longtime TDD member and Holocaust survivor Sylvia Saks will share the story of her family at the service. All Holocaust survivors, children of survivors, and liberators in our community are invited to participate in our special candle lighting ceremony.

YOM HAZIKARON: A week later is Israel’s Memorial Day, a day on which the entire country stops to remember those who have died in defense of the State of Israel. It is a day of remembering the fallen and giving thanks for their service and sacrifices.

YOM HA’ATZMAUT: Israel’s Independence Day will be celebrated on Thursday, May 9. This will mark the official end of Israel’s 70th birthday celebration. We have much for which to be grateful as we celebrate this holiday with our brothers and sisters in the land of Israel. With the elections in Israel complete and a new government taking shape, we pray for the peace and security of Israel and for blessing on all of Israel’s leaders – may this next year be a year of increased peace, prosperity, and progress.

YOM HA-EM: Or, as we call it here, Mother’s Day on Sunday, May 12. Mother’s Day is a wonderful opportunity for us to show our love, honor, respect, and appreciation for our mothers and the important women in our lives. Of course, we shouldn’t need a once-a-year holiday to remind us of the important role our mothers play and have played in our lives. To all of our *IMAHOT*, our Mothers, we say “thank you so very much.”

The following week, Sunday, May 19, is our **LAST YOM** of Religious School. The school year seems to have gone by so very quickly this year. I want to offer special thanks to Jamie Mafдали, our YELP Director (Youth Engagement: Learning & Programs), who has worked so hard as she has adjusted to her new role and assumed even more responsibilities here at TDD. Thank you for all that you do: for the love, energy, passion, and caring you bring to everything you do and show to our kids and families here at Temple Dor Dorim. I also want to thank Lori Blum, our Religious School Administrator, for all of her hard work and coordination this year. We have had a very good year in our Religious School, with lots of learning and great programs happening. I hope you’ll join me in thanking our teachers, assistants, and volunteers for all of their efforts here at Temple.

This month we also have something special happening every Shabbat. On Saturdays, we will celebrate with four of our families as their sons and daughters become B’nai Mitzvah. **Friday, May 3** is our First Friday Family Shabbat. We will begin with our Tot Shabbat at 5:30 pm, Shabbat Dinner at 6:00 pm, and our Family Service at 7:00 pm, with our 4th Grade students helping to lead our worship. We will also celebrate our May anniversaries and birthdays. **Friday, May 10** is our “Shabbat of Thanks,” as we will express our appreciation to all of our above and beyond donors for their support of Temple. **Friday, May 17** is our Youth Group Shabbat. TOUCHY will help to lead services, and we will also honor our graduating high school seniors.

Friday, May 31 is our Service of Confirmation at 7:30 pm. I hope you will join us for this very special service and ceremony as we mark this important milestone in the lives and education of our nine Confirmands this year: Rebecca Chiet, Chloe Nowack, Harrison Rodrigues, Daniela Roth, Brendon Samuels, Jennifer Silverman, Gabrielle Skolnick, Marley Solomon, and Mason Solomon. I am very proud of our Confirmation Class of 5779 – our largest class in several years. *Mazal Tov* to our students and their families!

As you can see, May will be a very busy month here at Temple filled with some very important and meaningful days. I look forward to seeing you at Temple.

Adam Silverman, President



With a heavy heart, I am mindful that this is now the second time in my first year as Temple President that I am writing about a deadly shooting at a synagogue in our country. Six months ago, the Tree of Life * Or L'Simcha Congregation in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania fell victim to one of the worst hate crimes in the United States. Then just last week, on the last day of Passover as my wife and I were getting ready for the TDD Gala, news broke of another hate-motivated shooting, this time at the Chabad of Poway in California.

Unfortunately, this disturbing trend of anti-Semitism is growing. I know that solving what is equal parts a cultural, political and moral issue is above my pay grade, but we all can and must continue to be vocal, to push back and to take a stand against hatred. To this end, I invite everyone to attend an important discussion on this very issue on **Wednesday, May 8 at 7:00 pm at B'nai Aviv**. Rabbi Sherman will be among the distinguished panelists along with professionals from various other Jewish organizations to educate our community on what modern anti-Semitism looks like, and what we can do to combat it. This important panel discussion, titled "*Anti-Semitism: a Contemporary Conversation about an Ancient Prejudice*" is open to the public and is timely and relevant. Please attend, and bring your family and friends along with you.

I want to reiterate as well that we are vigilant about the safety and security of everyone at TDD – this is our first priority. As many of you know, since 9/11 we have had a consistent security presence at Temple Dor Dorim. We have and will continue to use personnel from the Broward Sheriff's Office to secure our premises. However, because BSO is unable to meet our staffing needs for all of our hours of operation, we also supplement our security workforce with armed security personnel from Sig 9 Security, a private and reputable security company, many of whom are former members of law enforcement. Please rest assured that we continually and frequently assess and update our security measures. In this effort, last year we upgraded our security cameras and electronic door access. Earlier this year we had a security assessment of our property, and following the results of that assessment we are in the early stages of pursuing a security grant from the Department of Homeland Security. The grant is intended to assist houses of worship by subsidizing the costs for perimeter fencing, gates and bollards in front of our entrances. We will keep our membership apprised of any developments and additional security measures as we may take.

It is admittedly a troubling and alarming state of affairs that these measures are necessary, and that we continue to be targets of hateful attacks in our communities. As I write this article on Yom HaShoah, while my eldest daughter is bearing witness to the horrors of the Holocaust on the March of the Living in Poland, I am reminded of the importance of standing up to hatred and bigotry, in all of its ugly forms, and of our obligation as Jews to support and sustain our Jewish communities.



THE WONDERLAND GALA WAS A HUGE SUCCESS!



“Since the establishment of the State of Israel, four new holidays have been added to the Jewish calendar - *Yom HaShoah* (Holocaust Remembrance Day), *Yom HaZikaron* (Memorial Day), *Yom HaAtzmaut* (Independence Day), and *Yom Yerushalayim* (Jerusalem Day). In Israel, these holidays are observed as national holidays.” ReformJudaism.org

This year, three of the four holidays fall in May. We begin with *Yom HaShoah*, on the evening of May 1. We will come together at TDD for a **Community Holocaust Memorial Service at 7:00 pm**.

The evening of May 7 begins *Yom HaZikaron* which fittingly transitions into *Yom HaAtzmaut* on the evening of May 8. Israel can fully appreciate its independence after she first remembers her fallen. Having been in Israel for *Yom HaZikaron* and *Yom HaAtzmaut* I can say that the feeling and emotions evoked during these two days is indescribable. *Yom HaZikaron* begins in Israel with a [minute-long siren](#), people typically will stop whatever they are doing, including driving, and stand at attention until the siren is over. The day that follows has many national and local memorial services, somber music is heard on the radio, and TV programs are often different, too.

This year Temple Dor Dorim has five participants on the [March of the Living](#). We wish them a meaningful and safe journey to Poland and Israel. They will be commemorating *Yom HaShoah* in Poland with a march from Auschwitz to Birkenau. They will honor fallen soldiers in Israel on *Yom HaZikaron* and then celebrate as *Am Israel* on *Yom HaAtzmaut*.







A Time To Remember...A Time To Celebrate

This month brings the saddest as well as the most joyous days of the year in Israel. **Yom HaShoah** (Holocaust Remembrance Day), **Yom HaZikaron** (Memorial Day), and **Yom HaAtzmaut** (Israel Independence Day) were designated as public holidays by the government of Israel. These holidays are also observed in Jewish communities throughout the world.

Yom Hashoah is marked by numerous memorial ceremonies for those killed in the Holocaust. In Israel, Holocaust related programs are presented on television and radio as well as in theatres. That morning, a moment of silence is observed in memory of the six million victims of the Holocaust.

Yom HaZikaron pays tribute to all those who lost their lives fighting in Israel's wars. At sundown, a siren sounds throughout the country and everyone stops whatever they are doing to observe a moment of silence. The next morning, the siren is sounded again. Following another moment of silence, a national memorial service is held at the military cemetery on Mt. Herzl. The entire country then begins the process of moving from sadness to joy, as preparations for the next day's celebration of **Yom HaAtzmaut** begin.

Yom HaAtzmaut is a day of great joy and celebration throughout the State of Israel. 



A defining roadmap for our Empty Nesters where "everyone benefits when everyone can participate, resulting in a stronger and more diverse Temple and community!"

Speaking of the 3 C's, we have an opportunity to participate at our Empty Nesters' final event of this fiscal year - the **Annual Closing Dinner** scheduled for **Thursday, May 9, at 6:30 pm**. Again this year, it is being held at **Tarantella Restaurant** in Town Center. As usual, our host, John, is providing the comfort of the entire main room to accommodate our group's finale event. I know this will be a great meal with antipasto, salad, 5 entrée selections, dessert and beverage. It is a member-only event (singles may invite a guest) and our last chance to schmooze before going our separate ways for the summer. The cost is \$35 per person and, if you have not committed as yet, please call me at 954-389-8528 to attend. Time is short, act today!

Following WWII and the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948, four new holidays have been added to the Jewish calendar. We begin with **Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day)** at sunset, on Wednesday, May 1, which is observed as Israel's day of commemoration for the approximately Six Million Jews and Five Million others of all faiths who fought, suffered and died between 1933 and 1945 during this horrific genocide carried out by Nazi Germany. As is our tradition, observing the liberation of Nazi concentration camps, Temples Dor Dorim and B'nai Aviv will co-sponsor the **Weston Community Yom HaShoah Commemoration** to be held at Dor Dorim on **Wednesday, May 1, at 7:00 pm**.

Then at sunset on **Tuesday, May 7**, we commemorate **Yom HaZikaron, Israel's National Memorial Day**, which is Israel's designated Remembrance Day to memorialize soldiers and, more recently, to also include all fallen victims of terrorism. This is followed at sunset on **Wednesday, May 8**, with **Yom HaAtzmaut, Israel's Independence Day**, celebrating the Israeli Declaration of Independence in 1948 and the establishment of the Jewish State. The Israeli Knesset joined these two days together in order to convey a simple message that Israelis owe the independence and the very existence of the Jewish state to the individuals who sacrificed their lives for it. The fourth holiday, **Yom Yerushalayim, Jerusalem Day**, commemorating the re-unification of Jerusalem in 1967, will be observed in June.

This year our tribute to Motherhood falls on **Sunday, May 12. Mother's Day** is the special day for honoring Mothers throughout the world and, I am certain, holds great significance for all of us. Celebrating Mother's Day is a time for everyone to take the opportunity to pay tribute to their mothers for giving them life, raising them, providing all their love and support and to make them feel special. Although many of our Mothers are no longer with us, their impact on our lives and memories will be with each of us forever. And fellas, don't forget our wives, who have mothered our children, as they certainly deserve our special expression of love on this day.

Currently, we are in the midst of the seven-week cycle, Sefirat HaOmer (the Counting of the Omer), which is a semi-mourning period to commemorate the tragedies experienced by the Jewish people during this time. **Lag B'Omer** is on the 33rd day of the Counting of the Omer, which this year is sunset, **Wednesday, May 22**. Only on this day are the mourning restrictions lifted and, among other things, we are able to have weddings and other festivities. The counting began on the second day of Passover and culminates in the holiday of **Shavuot** on the 10th of June.

Concluding May events, on **Monday, May 27, is Memorial Day**, an American federal holiday that memorializes all men and women who have died while serving in the United States military protecting our country. Formerly known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. For many, Memorial Day signifies the beginning of summer, just as Labor Day in September, signifies its end.
