A Message from Rabbi Bloch

The Blessing of the Seventh Day

If you were asked to recite the Ten Commandments, would you be able? Could you recite them in order? If not, which ones stand out most in your mind? If you were the editor of the Torah, would you deem the Ten Commandments most important? Would there be any that you would take out? Would there be any that you would add?

One of the assignments that I often give my students is to study the Ten Commandments as they are written in the Torah, and then to create their own

version. I am always amazed and impressed by what they write. They come up with things such as: 1) Take care of one another 2) Don't talk bad about others 3) Give to those less fortunate 4) Respect each other and 5) Cherish your family--- just to name a few. Often the students' lists contain some of the most recognized of the Ten Commandments, such as: Don't steal and Don't murder. It is always interesting to me that while our students' versions of the Ten Commandments don't necessarily correspond to the Ten Commandments in the Torah, they often include rules found in the other 613 commandments that Jews are to follow. There is only one commandment that I never see in a student's Ten Commandment list. That would be the fourth, "Remember the Sabbath Day and keep it Holy." I am not surprised. I am not sure it would be remembered by most adults, let alone teenagers. In fact, several years ago, there was a nationwide poll rating the commandments in order of significance and this commandment, to keep the Sabbath, was put at the very bottom.

The Sabbath, unfortunately, has become trivial in a time when I believe we need it the most. Our society has become inundated with technologically advanced items, and we are always moving from place to place. We never have the opportunity to slow down and just breathe. Every week in our *siddur* we read a prayer that many of us are familiar with from the commonly sung song, *v'shamru*. This prayer teaches us that Shabbat is ours and we are to guard it, cherish it, and celebrate it. Every week we have the opportunity to celebrate time and learn that our time here on earth is sacred. We have the opportunity to pause, to sit, and to just be. We are given the possibility for renewal, growth, and learning. And we have one of life's greatest blessings, the opportunity to spend time with our families, our communities, and G-d.

As we approach the holiday of Shavuot this coming weekend, and again celebrate the receiving of the Ten Commandments, let us remember the gift of the fourth commandment. Let us learn to guard it so that we will always know the blessing of the seventh day, Shabbat. As Rabbi Dov Peretz Elkins teaches:

Six days shall you be a workaholic; on the seventh day, shall you join the serene company of human beings.

Six days shall you take orders from your boss; on the seventh day, shall you be master/mistress of your own life.

Six days shall you toil in the market; on the seventh day, shall you detach from money matters.

Six days shall you create, drive, create, invent, push, drive; on the seventh day, shall you reflect.

Six days shall you be the perfect success; on the seventh day, shall you remember that not everything is in your power.

Six days shall you be a miserable failure; on the seventh day, shall you be on top of the world.

Six days shall you enjoy the blessings of work; on the seventh day, shall you understand that being is as important as doing.



Empty Nesters Message

Hi Nesters and Friends,

As we look forward to June, the final month of TDD's fiscal year, we take a glance back to May, an exciting month, when we celebrated both something "Old" and something "New." The something old was our Synagogue's 24th Anniversary Gala, which we have been unable to celebrate together since March 2019. It was as "Gala" as any celebration could be with strong drinks, delicious food, loud music, wonderful auction items and, most importantly (next to the much needed revenue) was the enthusiastic, youngish crowd of attendees. Young and old, generation to generation, we all drank, ate and danced (except me) the night away. Thank you to the committee, chaired by Rachel DiDio, TDD staff and Scott Kushner and Palm Caterers for making this a great Fun and Fund-raising evening!

This was followed with something new the next weekend, as we celebrated the (delayed) Installation of our popular Senior Rabbi, Marci R. Bloch. Although in the position for the past 2 Pandemic years, this was the first time to get our congregation together at Shul and hold a meaningful and beautiful Shabbat Service with over 10 clergy, both Rabbis and Cantors, participating. The service was followed with a special tasty Oneg Shabbat. Then Saturday morning there was Torah Study with Rabbi Joel Soffin followed by a Bagel and Nosh, and closed on Sunday with a Mini Mitzvotof collecting footwear for charity, preparing snack bags and a blood drive. Thank goodness our Rabbi is now official!

As covered in my May Newsletter article, the Empty Nesters' year was, at best, bitter sweet as we held many events on Zoom with 1 Continental Breakfast program, 1 Chanukah Brunch program and our Nesters' October Kickoff and March (early) Closing Dinners. Fortunately, we were able to have most of our scheduled Lunch and Learn programs with Rabbi Bloch. With our membership reduced the past 2 years from 107 to 77 and participation to a 33% average, partially due to Covid, it is primarily reflective of our growing average age, which is now in the 80's and growing. Additionally, with my stepping down as President, we have no one from our current Empty Nesters, as constituted, to step up and assume the leadership role.

The aging trend can only be reversed by the addition of 50, 60 and 70 year olds to the group. Our Synagogue has such an assemblage on-board, requiring only a few of their influential members to take the leadership reins and create this new "Schmoozers," TDD's 50-plus Social Auxiliary. Going forward, this auxiliary is badly needed at TDD to add to the wonderful membership incentives we currently offer. At any rate, I will absolutely be available to assist as an active participant with the new leadership of our senior auxiliary.

In the May Newsletter, I thanked all those who provided the love and support shown to Alice and me during the past 17 years. I loved every minute of those years and will miss the interaction with the many individuals the position provided. However, I am far from finished with my volunteering and activities at TDD. I plan to remain on the Finance Committee and will also ensure the continuation of the Lunch and Learn with Rabbi Bloch monthly program, until it returns to the newly constituted senior auxiliary.

Finally, for you to honor for happy occasions, or memorialize for those sad occasions, the "Alice and Gary Holtzman Empty Nesters Tzedakah Fund" is alive, well and available for your donations. The fund continues to support Temple Dor Dorim programs including: Education, Youth, Ritual and all Auxiliaries.

Sadly, after writing monthly articles for the Empty Nesters since 2003 during Lee Redstone's Presidency, this will be my final column. However, I would expect to continue with emails every so often. Until then...

HOW TO REPORT AN ANTISEMITIC OR BIAS INCIDENT

We all have a responsibility to report and respond to antisemitism or hate when we see it.

TO REPORT AN ANTISEMITIC OR HATE INCIDENT, VISIT:

ADL.ORG/REPORTINCIDENT-URJ

IF YOU FEAR FOR YOUR SAFETY OR THE SAFETY OF OTHERS, CALL 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY.

What should I report?

You should report any incident you perceive as antisemitic, biased or hateful.

Here are some examples:

- Antisemitic or other hateful graffiti in public places, including synagogues and schools.
- Vandalism of religious artifacts such as mezuzahs or menorahs and holy places.
- Online harassment, including hateful social media posts and emails. Remember to take a screenshot!
- Verbal harassment, including emails and voicemails.
- Media-based incidents, including antisemitic or hateful content in a news story.
- White supremacist propaganda.
