

A Message from Rabbi Bloch

Dear TDD,

Thirty-six years ago, this coming Shabbat, I became a Bat Mitzvah. As we all know, thirty-six is a special number in the Jewish tradition. It is the number 18 multiplied by two, or as we say, "double chai". It is also the number that represents the hidden 36 righteous people (*tzadikim nistarim*) in the world. Celebrating thirty-six is always special!

As I reflect on my Bat Mitzvah, I fondly recall so many sacred moments of that day such as sharing the service with my cousin, wearing my refusenik bracelet for a young woman who couldn't have her Bat Mitzvah in Communist Russia, and the special words my Rabbi shared with me. When I look back to that time, I am also reminded of who I was and who I have become. Judaism teaches us to look back and to look forward. As it says in *Pirkei Avot*, the Ethics of our Ancestors, "Know your origins and where you are headed now..."

As I reflect on this *simcha* and milestone in my life and my own growth, I cannot help but also reflect on the life of our congregation and how much has happened this past year. Together we have been through losses, sickness, and change. Yet, we have also experienced so much joy and celebration. We have welcomed two new staff members to our congregational family, David Pasternack and Jessica Smiley. We celebrated Shabbat Frozen style and with ponies and s'mores, and let's not forget ShaBubble Shabbat. We slicked our hair back at the Purim Spiel for Shushan nights. We have brought Shabbat and holidays to the living rooms of our members. We have danced with the Torah and danced with each other. We have celebrated our own birthdays and Israel's 75th. We have nourished our souls through learning our ancient texts. We have listened to the beautiful voices of our children as they pray "May the One, the One who makes peace, bring peace down." And we have made chicken soup for those who are sick, packed medical bags for those in need, and fed the hungry. We have uplifted our friends with supportive hugs at shiva minyans. We have taught and fought against antisemitism, and we have been proud of our Jewish heritage. We took a walk on the wild side at our roaring Gala. And we say shalom to our dear Sheila Woldenberg and wish her many blessings on her retirement.

As we look back, let us look back with much pride and know that we are headed toward a great tomorrow.

Just as when we conclude a book of the Torah, let us conclude this synagogue year by saying: *Chazak, chazak, v'nitchazeik* -- Strength, strength and let us be strengthened.

Executive Director's Message

Dear Temple Dor Dorim,

June is busting out all over as the saying goes. It certainly is true for us at Temple Dor Dorim. We are always busy in the summer with camp, preparing for the next school year and getting ready for High Holy Days. This year we do not even have one open classroom with over 230 campers taking up all the rooms and even using part of our Atrium. Good problem to have for sure. There are many exciting activities being planned for camp and with many day trips. This year the Team of Judy Frye, as overall Director of the Camp, and Jessica Smiley, as Director of

Camp Travel, will be heading up all things camp related to ensure a very memorable summer for your children.

The summertime is also the period we use to really clean the building and classrooms. This year, with no classrooms open during the summer (since we are so full), it is a bit more challenging to be able to go into the rooms and clean carpets, wax floors, etc., but it will all be done before school starts in August.

We will also be touching up paint and installing our new door access system on the front and back of each classroom and between the School and the Temple. This makes the rooms much more secure and gets us away from a key system which is easily duplicated. The Temple Board was very happy to have made a \$50,000 investment in security to ensure door access is more secure, making sure we continue to be one of the safest schools in the area.

We also will be starting the major cleaning of the building to prepare for the High Holy Days. This year it will not be nearly as difficult and costly a process since we changed custodial companies, and they are doing a terrific job every day for us.

We finally received our city permit to resurface and stripe the driveway. Over the next few weeks, we will begin this project as well.

As the High Holy Days are approaching, we are looking at ways to ensure our overall safety. Stay tuned for more in formation shortly.

If you are a member of the Temple, bills for the 2023-2024 fiscal year will be mailed out at the end of June. Overall, Temple dues are staying the same as last year (we haven't risen the rate in many years). The only cost increase that Temple Dor Dorim had to pass along some of is for Security. This was necessary since we have had to significantly increase safety for both our Temple and Early Childhood Center due to the times we live in.

This being the June and July issue, I wish you all a happy, fun and safe summer. As you all know, we will be welcoming our new Director of the ECC, Sandra Blasberg, in June and saying goodbye to a true Temple Dor Dorim/ ECC legend, Sheila Woldenberg.

We are here to support any of your needs at any time. We are a phone call away.



Legacy Society Message

Temple Dor Dorim Legacy Society – Some Thoughts on Tisha B'Av

Tisha B'Av, the 9th day of the month of Av (July 26-27, 2023), is the saddest day on the Jewish calendar. We fast and pray, as we mark the destruction the Holy Temple in Jerusalem, that same Western Wall, the Kotel, where we still pray today. In fact, the First Temple was burned by the Babylonians in 423 BCE and the Second Temple fell to the Romans in 70 CE, both in the month of Av. Later, in our history, more tragedies happened on this day, including the 1290 expulsion of England's Jews and the 1492 banishment of all Jews from Spain.

That is not to say that the month of Av is an unlucky month for the Jews, but it does serve to remind us that bad things do occasionally happen, not only to us, but to the world. Our recent encounter with COVID is a painful reminder. We are mindful of the story of Joseph, in the Book of Genesis, when he saved his people (and Egypt), by advising Pharaoh to plan for the future by putting away grain today, so that it would be available in later times of famine.

Members of our Legacy Society are following in the footsteps of Joseph. We are putting resources away today, in the form of a gift or a bequest to TDD, in our wills, IRA's, insurance policies, or estate plans, so that the Temple will be ready to weather any untoward event that may occur in the future.

Won't you join us in helping Dor Dorim prepare for the future? It only requires a promise to put away a small amount to protect the very things that make our lives worthwhile today – our Religious School, our Youth Group, our Torah study sessions, our Brotherhood, Sisterhood, and Empty Nesters. 





HOW TO REPORT AN ANTISEMITIC OR BIAS INCIDENT

We all have a responsibility to report and respond to antisemitism or hate when we see it.

TO REPORT AN ANTISEMITIC OR HATE INCIDENT, VISIT:

ADL.ORG/REPORTINCIDENT-URJ

IF YOU FEAR FOR YOUR SAFETY OR THE SAFETY OF OTHERS, CALL 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY.

What should I report?

You should report any incident you perceive as antisemitic, biased or hateful.

Here are some examples:

- Antisemitic or other hateful graffiti in public places, including synagogues and schools.
- Vandalism of religious artifacts such as mezuzahs or menorahs and holy places.
- Online harassment, including hateful social media posts and emails. Remember to take a screenshot!
- Verbal harassment, including emails and voicemails.
- Media-based incidents, including antisemitic or hateful content in a news story.
- White supremacist propaganda.

Make an impact in the fight against antisemitism and hate.
