



A Message from Rabbi Bloch

Dear TDD,

It's 2024! As we begin the new secular year, it's hard to believe all that has happened since last year. It's also hard to believe how much the world has changed since October 7, 2023.

As I reflect on the last three months since the brutal attack by Hamas on Israel, I think about the roller coaster of emotions – the fear, the angst, and the feeling of deep sadness and loneliness for all Jews around the world. I

also think of the deep strength and resilience of our brothers and sisters in Israel. I think about the numerous wedding proposals, the births, the soldiers dancing in the streets. I think about how so many people have flocked to the fields to help revitalize the land and literally help it to flourish. And I can't help to think of another kind of New Year – a Jewish one – Tu B'Shevat. This holiday is considered a time of renewal, much like Rosh HaShanah. Tu B'Shevat, the 15th of Shevat, honors the earliest blooming of Israel's trees and marks the beginning of a new fruit bearing cycle.

In synagogues all over America, children often sing songs about nature or create art with trees. Many congregations hold a Tu B'Shevat Seder which reflects on the seasons, the human connection to nature, and the land of Israel.

And this year feels so different than others. Seeing people in Israel harvest the land during a war takes what is often deemed a pediatric holiday to a very different level. It reminds us of our responsibility to rebuild and revitalize the land. It reminds us that we must always sow the seeds for future generations. It reminds us of the history of the Jewish people and our struggle to exist in this world. It reminds us *Am Yisrael Chai* – that we are still here and will be here...always.





# A Message from Sandra Blasberg

As we enter the New Year, I wanted to first wish you a Happy and Healthy New Year as well as share an enriching and new experience that the children from the Early Childhood Center had last month while we were celebrating Chanukah.

As the Festival of Lights, Chanukah holds a profound significance for families around the world. Beyond the joyous celebrations and traditional rituals, bringing light to the preschool during Chanukah carries a rich symbolic meaning that extends beyond the flicker of candles. Chanukah commemorates the miracle of the oil that lasted eight days when it should have only lasted for one. The lighting of the *chanukiah* (mostly known as a menorah) symbolizes the triumph of light over darkness, of hope over despair. In the preschool setting, this symbolism takes on a special significance.

Before we delve into the deeper layers of this tradition and explore why illuminating the preschool environment is a meaningful practice, let me share with you the excitement the children, teachers and families had when they walked into our Library, which was transformed into a dark/light and shadow room. I hope you saw the pictures we posted on Dojo but let me describe the room. The windows of the library were all covered, creating a dark room. We placed black lights, light tables with transparent and fluorescent dreidels, a projector with two menorahs in front which were projected onto a white screen, neon tape on the floor creating a path for car toys to go through, neon paint, transparent letters, magna tiles, neon party cups to build, colored bubbles and Chanukah music blasting! As the children and teachers walked in the room, the expressions on their faces were in awe!

Chanukah provides a unique opportunity for children in the enchanting world of lights and shadows. Beyond the traditional *chanukiah* lighting, encouraging kids to explore lights and shadows during Chanukah holds immense value in their developmental journey. Here's why it's important for children to embrace the interplay of light and shadows during this festive season.

- Lights and shadows have a magical quality that captivates a child's imagination. The interplay of lights and shadows becomes a canvas for children to express their creativity. Encourage them to create shadow puppets, tell stories using shadows, or experiment with different light sources.
- Chanukah carries rich symbolism related to light overcoming darkness. Exploring lights and shadows provides a tangible way for children to understand and connect with these symbolic concepts.
- Engaging with lights and shadows is not just visually appealing; it also contributes to cognitive development. Children learn about spatial relationships, depth perception, and cause-and-effect as they observe how light sources create shadows. These experiences lay the foundation for critical thinking and problem-solving skills.
- Lights and shadows can evoke various emotions, from excitement to comfort. During Chanukah, the warm glow of the *chanukiah* fosters a sense of security and belonging. Allowing children to engage with these emotions in a safe and controlled environment contributes to their emotional intelligence, helping them understand and navigate their feelings.

In conclusion, encouraging children to explore lights and shadows during Chanukah is a holistic approach to their development. From stimulating imagination to fostering cognitive and emotional growth, these experiences contribute to a well-rounded and enriched childhood. It was a wonderful experience to embrace the magic of lights and shadows during Chanukah and watch as your children's curiosity and creativity shined brightly throughout the festival and beyond.

My wish to you is that the flickering lights of the chanukiah inspire us all to cultivate kindness, compassion, and understanding in our homes and communities.


It has been my pleasure to work with these groups for more than ten years. It is exciting to share with them how we developed, what we stand for, and to imagine future possibilities and directions going forward.





#### HAPPY NEW YEAR 2024 FROM THE TEMPLE DORIM LEGACY SOCIETY

I know what you're thinking. As I sat down to write this newsletter, I knew that this New Year, Jewish people in Israel, in America and all over the world are wondering "Will this be a happy New Year for us? For our families? For our country?"

As of this writing, Israel seems to be winning the ground war in Gaza, but there are still more than 100 hostages being held by Hamas, and the world media pressure for Israel to declare a truce or ceasefire continues to grow louder. Anti-Israel demonstrations on college campuses and world capitals continue. Jews everywhere are beginning to wonder, "Am I and my family safe?"

There is an old adage - "There is safety in numbers." It means that when you are part of a group, you have the ability to look out for one another. You are less likely to be blindsided by an event or an attack of some kind that may harm you or your family. That's what Jews do – they look out for, and take care of, one another.

Remember the political fighting in Israel, less than 6 months ago? It's gone. Survival is more important. At Temple Dor Dorim, we weathered the onslaught of COVID and survived with each other's help and companionship. We need to weather this new epidemic of antisemitism together too. As a family. We need to stick together and help each other. That includes helping the Jews in Israel and in other countries, who also at this time, may be feeling more than a bit insecure. We need to let them know that they are not alone!

Helping also means preparing for our own future. We need you to join the TDD Legacy Society if you haven't already. Plan to leave a gift for Temple Dor Dorim in your will, your estate plan, insurance policy, IRA or whatever. Make sure that your children and grandchildren will always have a Jewish home and friends and extended family they can turn to if things go wrong. And should things go right, God willing, it will be nice for the Temple to have a security fund to help pay for education and programming and simchas for those same future generations.


