Through a centers-based approach, children are exposed to a language rich environment that encourages the early skills necessary for reading and writing. 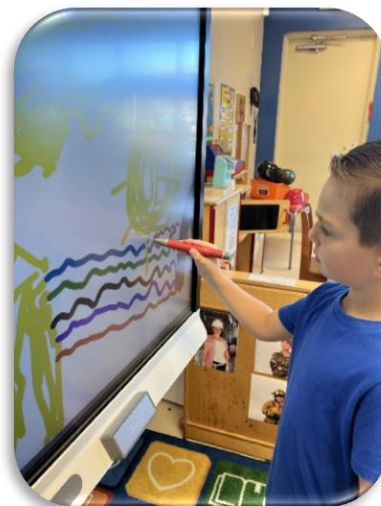

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Our Early Childhood staff is dedicated to meeting the individual needs of every child while promoting their physical, emotional, social and cognitive growth. Our learning environment cultivates challenges that enable children to achieve their maximum potential. Our staff is able to elicit creativity, imagination and divergent thinking in our children by fostering their independence, building their self-confidence and helping them to develop a positive self image.

Our Early Childhood program meets the highest standards in education. **We are the only program in Weston to be accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC).** Our Kindergarten Readiness Scores are among the highest in the state. Set in a warm and nurturing learning environment, our developmentally appropriate curriculum ensures that children are able to develop at their own rate when provided with activities that are planned around their unique abilities.



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The Nest

(3-11 months)

Our infant program focuses on experiences that foster curiosity and discovery. From birth to age three, the most rapid form of brain development takes place. Classroom experiences strengthen fine and gross motor development and acquisition of language in a warm, nurturing and safe environment. The Nest is comprised of two classrooms where children transition based on individual growth and development.

Toddlers

(12-24 months by September 1)

Toddlers will learn through active exploration, play and interaction with children, teachers and their environment. Emphasis will be placed on acquiring independence, self-confidence, motor and language skills, and a sense of self.

Twos

(2 years by September 1)

Through dramatic play, hands-on games and activities, children will continue to develop and refine motor and communication skills. Emphasis will be placed on fine and gross motor development, expanding vocabulary, creative expression, cooperation, and self-help skills.

Threes

(3 years by September 1)

Emphasis at this level will be on providing choices, challenges, and opportunities that promote intellectual, social and emotional growth. Children will learn through problem solving, cause and effect, and math and science concepts through the use of blocks, puzzles, and manipulatives. Pre-reading and writing skills are emphasized through language-based activities and hands-on experiences through center-based and small group instruction.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN / VPK PLUS PROGRAM

(4 YEARS BY SEPTEMBER 1)

Through an integrated approach, centers and thematic units will connect all areas of the curriculum, build concepts and add meaning to real life experiences. Reading and writing become an integral part of the classroom. Focus will be on academic readiness skills and active participation in the classroom and school community. Emphasis is placed on Kindergarten Readiness and is aligned with State Common Core Curriculum. Pre-K students can enroll in either our Dual Language program or our STEAM program. (See back page for more details.) Our school has one of the highest kindergarten readiness rates in the county and is open to the community.



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Dual Language Class for Threes & Pre-K

- Dual language programs are linked to enhancing cognitive skills, advancing early reading skills, solving problems, and improving overall school performance.
- Research shows that the *bilingual brain is sharper and more focused*.
- Students will split their day between English and Spanish language while learning curriculum in reading, Handwriting Without Tears, math, science, health & nutrition, technology & STEAM.
- Our dual language pre-k class students are immersed in Spanish through games, puppets, flannel board activities, cultural dances, food and conversation.



Full STEAM Ahead for Pre-K

Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math



STEAM Education is a hands-on learning method that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics to guide children's interest, language, and critical thinking. The STEAM approach to education allows children to take risks, engage in experiential learning, problem-solve, collaborate, and be creative at the same time. Your child will...

- Learn to recognize attributes of height, weight & capacity of everyday objects
- Engage in hands-on exploration to practice, test and deconstruct their ideas
- Create science journals to document their experiences
- Use various methods to practice math skills such as counting, measuring and balancing
- Engage in art activities that explore a variety of writing and drawing tools as well as investigate shapes, colors, shadows and the elements of negative space in art
- Explore science concepts as they work in our TDD garden
- Use technology such as iPads to enhance learning in the classroom
- Engage in robotics and coding activities



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
